Job Purpose:

DN Colleges expects the practice of all teaching staff to be of the highest quality. It is anticipated that the post-holder's duties will include being a Lecturer and have programme tutor responsibilities for a caseload of students. The major commitment will be to deliver high quality teaching and learning experience, and assess students in the specialism of Fabrication and Welding.

Job Duties and Responsibilities:

- To act as a Programme Tutor for a caseload of full-time and/or part-time students.
- To assure the quality of the student learning experience by effective delivery of formal scheduled teaching and tutorials paying due regard to student progression towards successful completion.
- To embrace new learning technologies/ILT and implement the same within own teaching.
- Manage and maintain student morale and discipline, working closely with college managers, and the team to assure an appropriate learning environment.
- To record and report in an accurate and timely manner data and information, including eILPs, e-registers, assessments, and student progress records.
- Ensure teaching file is effectively maintained to ensure schemes of work, lesson plans and progress tracking documents meet robust quality assurance procedures.
- To keep up to date with academic/vocational subjects and develop and maintain links with industry.
- Contribute to a sensitive and supportive approach to safeguarding and equality and diversity.
- To perform such other duties as reasonably correspond to the general character of the post and are commensurate with its level of responsibility.

Teaching Duties

1. To deliver high quality teaching on a range of courses within Fabrication & Welding.

2. To develop Maths and English in lessons for all students.
3. Working with our Lead Practitioners to develop an exciting and engaging learning experience, using a range of innovative and creative teaching and learning techniques, including appropriate use of new and emerging technologies, ensuring they are inclusive, promote equality and diversity, motivate students, and encourage independence and autonomy.
4. Adopt a consistent approach in dealing with student discipline in accordance with College policies.
5. Ensure that students understand, are involved, and share in responsibility for assessment of their learning.
6. Provide opportunities for students to understand how the specialist area relates to the wider social, economic, and environmental context.
7. Ensure schemes of work, lesson plans and progress tracking documents meet robust quality assurance procedures.
8. Contribute to the organisation's rigorous quality cycle by producing accurate and standardised assessment information and keeping appropriate records of assessment decisions and students' progress.
9. Cover classes for absent colleagues where appropriate.

Pastoral Duties

10. To actively monitor student absences and behaviour and take appropriate action as required.
11. To agree and set high aspirations through challenging personal targets for your designated student caseload through the eILP to enable students to fulfil their potential.
12. Liaise with members of the course team, student support team and, as appropriate, with parents/carers in the support of students. Attend parents' evenings.
13. Provide students with appropriate information about the organisation and its facilities, and encourage students to use the organisation's services, as appropriate.
14. Refer students to information on potential current and future learning and career opportunities and appropriate specialist support services.

Curriculum Development

15. Participate in developing ideas and activity for generating income through curriculum development for the area and wider college where applicable.
16. Building relationships with industry partners to further enhance the learning experience, and encourage progression into industry.

Organisational Role

17. To be a Programme Tutor for one or more courses in Fabrication & Welding.
18. Be responsible for efficient administrative duties in areas such as admissions, time-tabling, examinations, assessment of progress, student attendance and quality assurance (including course quality files).
19. Engage in the analysis of data and target setting to raise standards of retention and achievement for your respective group/s.

Marketing Role

- 20. To be actively involved in the recruitment of students by undertaking promotional activities such as Open Days, Roadshows, Admissions and Information Events. This will involve flexible working (i.e. occasional evenings and weekend working).
- 21. To contribute to the production of publicity materials for courses and other activities with which you are involved, including destinations and success stories.
- 22. To maintain the professional image of the College in the duties you are undertaking by demonstrating excellent time keeping and customer service skills while undertaking such duties.

Working with Colleagues

- 23. To work in close co-operation Curriculum Leads, Curriculum Directors, members of course teams and other working groups. This will include leading meetings with Programme teams and attending other working groups.
- 24. To collaborate cross-functionally to enhance and standardise assessment and learning approach.
- 25. Work with members of the department's management team and other colleagues in the development, review, and evaluation of the curriculum, including contribution to the self-assessment process.
- 26. Work with colleagues with relevant expertise to identify and address literacy, language, and numeracy development in own specialist area.

Professional Development

- 27. To update regularly in your specialist area(s) and to participate in staff development activities including sharing good practice as required and submitting timely CPD records.
- 28. To actively participate in any scheme of regular performance review and appraisal adopted by the College Group.

Additional Duties

- 29. Work with managers and employees to support the developing high performing culture of the learning organisation and facilitate cultural change.

Undertake other tasks, as directed, to meet the needs of the College that reasonably correspond to the general character of the post and are commensurate with its level of responsibility.
